ALICE IN OHIO

ALICE stands for Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed. The more than 16,000 ALICE households in our region are working but not earning enough to keep up with the cost of living. Another 6500+ households in Crawford, Marion, and Wyandot are earning below the Federal Poverty Level.

Nearly half of the households in our tri-county area live below the poverty level or struggle to make ends meet as ALICE families. Our Bold Goal community impact partners are working to help these families navigate emergencies and find solid ground on their paths to financial stability.

ALICE struggles go deeper than finances. 23% of ALICE households reported feeling depressed and anxious every day, compared to 13% of respondents who could afford basics.

ALICE can be any age, race, or ethnicity.
ALICE families look just like yours, and at nearly one in three households in our tricounty area, chances are they are your neighbors, coworkers, classmates, and friends.

ALICE families can easily fall from the "benefit cliff," losing public benefits they count on when a small wage increase moves them beyond an income threshold. This makes it harder for them to make ends meet, even as their salary increases.
